### Yearly Report

To the Citizens of Prospect:

In 2017 our Ambulance service had a total of 251 calls. Out of this number Stockton had 134 transports, Prospect had 47. No transports for Prospect were 17 and no transports for Stockton were 43. There were 5 stand by with Fire Departments and 5 transports from Waldo County General Hospital. This brings our total 26 calls higher than 2016. The biggest increase was in the no transport category.

For those of you who have not seen it yet, we have a new ambulance. It is a 2017 Braun Ambulance on a Ford F 450 chassis. This new rig is rated one of the safest patient compartments in the industry. It is also 4 wheel drive with a truck style cab. The crew is very comfortable operating out of this new ambulance.

We have had our share of snow and ice this winter. Which brings me to urge everyone to have your driveways plowed and sanded, also wide enough for the new ambulance. We have had several instances in both towns that we have had a hard time getting to the residence. If we can't get to you we can't help you. We are here to help you in your time of need.

If anyone is interested in joining the Ambulance Service, please feel free to contact me at 5674322. We are always looking for more personnel who are interested in serving their community.

As usual, I would like to thank the Fire Department for helping whenever we have called. This is usually for lift assists, but can be for anything. Please recognize these people for their efforts.

We will be having our 4<sup>th</sup> Run For Your Life road race again this year in September. The race keeps getting bigger and better each year. I will keep you informed on the exact date when it's known.

## GREETINGS:

In the name of the State of Maine, you are required by law to notify and warn the inhabitants of the Town of Prospect qualified to vote in Town affairs to meet at the Prospect Town office on **April 20<sup>th</sup>, 2018 at 10:00 AM** then and there to vote on Articles 1 and 2, and to notify and warn the voters to meet at the Prospect Fire Station in said Town on **April 21<sup>st</sup>, 2018 at 9:00 AM**. - Article 1. To elect a Moderator to preside at said meeting.
- Article 2. To elect by secret ballot one (1) Selectman for a three (3) year term, & (1) Road Commissioner for a one (1) year term. **Polls will be opened to vote on Article 2 on April 20<sup>th</sup>, 2018 from 10:00 AM at which time the adjourned meeting will be reopened at the Prospect Fire Station, then and there to act on the remaining Articles on the Warrant.**
- Article 3. To see what action the voters of the Town will take in regards to the excise tax revenue and the disposition of the same. **Selectmen and Budget Committee recommend that up to \$83,000 of the excise tax be applied to the Town Officers payroll and related expenses and that any remaining funds not appropriated at this meeting are returned to surplus.**
- Article 4. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and/or appropriate for the salaries of the Selectmen, Assessors, and Overseers of the poor. **Selectmen and Budget Committee recommend appropriating \$4,000 for each Selectman totaling \$12,000.**

Greetings; It is that time of year again for your annual town meeting. I have a few things to mention and discuss with you today. Please take the time and call your Assessor's Agent for an appointment if you feel your house is overvalued. Other reasons to call would be if you have buildings that may be gone or dilapidated. We as assessors of your community would like to have the corrected information before we send out tax bills and reduce the need for abatements. If you bought your house as a foreclosure it may not have been lived in for a while and may need to be reviewed. Personal from Hamlin Associates will be out to review properties in your community; we strive to get the correct information for your home. The owner's cooperation does make for a better assessment and a better result in fair and equitable assessment.

If you are a resident and have not applied for the home stead, please fill this paperwork out and get it to your town office or Hamlin Associates by April 1<sup>st</sup>. This is a reduction of value to your home before the taxes are figured worth, \$20,000.00. If your home is valued at 120,000.00 your tax bill will be calculated on 100,000.00.00, it sure does help on your tax bill.

Tree Growth, Open Space and Farm Land classifications must be filled out by the April 1<sup>st</sup> date also, so please contact me if you need guidance or just want information on these programs.

Veterans who served in a Federally Recognized war period and reached the age of 62 or may be disabled may qualify for the Veteran's Exemption. We will need a completed application and a copy of your DD214. Send it to your town office or my office by April 1<sup>st</sup> so we can process this for your tax bill. You may also qualify if you are an unmarried spouse of a qualified veteran that has passed so please contact me if you have any questions.
