


WorkSafe BC Supplemental COVID-19 Safety Plan Summerland Curling Club (SCC)

January 18, 2022. v2.0

This document lists the changes the Summerland Curling Club has implemented in its reopening plans with health and safety at the forefront. We have followed the guidelines and considerations for safe reopening amidst the COVID-19 pandemic, utilizing the Hierarchy of Control Chart from WorkSafe BC. The four controls listed below were the primary focus for creating our Supplemental Safety Plan.



Summerland Curling Club Supplemental Safety Plan:

Levels of Protection

1. Physical Distancing (First Level Protection)

- We will be limiting the number of people in the curling club. Our capacity limits in the lobby are 50% of total occupancy.
- Capacity numbers will be monitored by our two Ice Technicians, Andrew Barnes, and Dean Jones. If they are away, the League Rep will monitor capacity numbers.
- Lockers are in use this year.
- Tables with 4 chairs are stationed 2 meters apart in the lobby for curlers to use.
- In the lounge, our capacity is 50% of total occupancy. However, the PH order on Dec 23, 2021 ordered our lounge to close and that order has been extended to at least Feb 16, 2022.
- Physical distancing is strongly recommended for the common areas of the club as well as on the ice.
- Anyone showing COVID-19 symptoms must self isolate and follow guidelines set out in the SCC Illness Policy before they return to the curling club.

2. Engineering Controls: (Second Level Protection)

- We have Installed plexiglass at the bar area to provide a physical barrier to airborne transmission.
- Two standing hand sanitization stations and 2 wall hand sanitization stations have been installed at the curling club.
- A railing has been installed near the bar to reinforce the flow of patrons at the bar.
- COVID-19 signs have been added to the walls to remind patrons of the rules.
- Masks are mandatory in the common areas of the club and are optional on the ice.

3. Administrative Controls: (Third Level Protection)

- Members, staff, and volunteers are encouraged to use hand sanitizer when entering the facility.
- Signage will notify people not to enter if they are sick or have any symptoms, to wash or sanitize hands frequently and to always maintain 2m physical distancing.
- The SCC Return to Curling Plan, the Risk Management Document and the Illness Policy will all be available on our website and at the front door entrance for all participants.

4. Personal Protective Equipment (PPE): (Fourth Level Protection)

- Masks must be worn in the common areas of the SCC.
- Members are responsible for bringing their own PPE to the curling rink.
- If a medical or First Aid event occurs on the ice, staff must wear a face mask to treat the injured person.
- Wash hands after removing PPE.

Staff Training:

- Before staff enter the SCC workplace and throughout the day, employees should selfmonitor for symptoms associated with COVID-19.
- Our Ice Technician and League Reps will monitor user groups to ensure they are following the SCC COVID-19 Safety Plan protocols.
- The SCC will education staff, volunteers, and members on facility expectations.
- Curlers can leave all their belongings in their lockers.
- Staff are required to always wear a mask in the club.
- Staff training to include the following documents:
 - Parks and Recreation COVID-19 Facility Guidelines, Summerland Curling Club
 - SCC COVID-19 Return to Curling Plan Jan 18, 2022
 - WorkSafe BC Supplemental COVID-19 Safety Plan SCC 2022
 - SCC Illness Policy Jan 18 2022

Cleaning and Sanitization:

- Our goal is to increase cleaning and disinfection of high touch points to prevent COVID-19 from spreading through contaminated surfaces.
- Remove any unnecessary items such as tools, equipment, benches, tables, chairs etc. from public and staff spaces.
- Ensure that hands are sanitized when entering the curling club.
- 2 standing hand sanitizing stations have been installed at the front entrance and in the lounge. 2 wall mounted hand cleaning stations have also been installed.
- Tables and chairs are located 2m apart in the lobby to change shoes.
- Washrooms in the curling club will be thoroughly cleaned in the morning by arena staff. Plus, they will clean high touch point areas in the washrooms at mid-day.
- High Touch Points in the lobby and lounge (i.e. light switches, doorknobs, chairs, counters, buttons, railings etc.) will be cleaned and disinfected twice daily by our Ice Technician.
- Scoreboards and curling rock handles will be sanitized after each game.

- The use of shared items such as dishes, utensils, food items etc. is not allowed.
- Tables and chairs in the lounge will be sanitized by our Ice Technician in the morning and before the nighttime draw.
- All carpets in the lobby, stairs and lounge will be vacuumed each morning.
- Disinfectant spray is available in the office to spray office equipment before use.

Dealing With COVID-19 Cases

- Any staff, volunteer or members of the curling club must refer to the SCC Illness Policy for handling any case related to COVID-19.
- The Illness Policy is posted on the wall of the lobby of the club, in the green COVID binder at the club and on our SCC website.
- Those who know they have been exposed to an individual who has tested positive for COVID- 19 must monitor their own symptoms and self isolate as required.
- If a patron is symptomatic at the curling club, they will be asked to return home, monitor their symptoms and self isolate as required.
