### FEATURED BOOKS OF THE MONTH

- **Texas Ranger by James Patterson** – A standalone novel. Part murder mystery, part protagonist self-discovery, this piece takes the reader down to the heart of Texas. In this Western thriller, a Texas Ranger fights for his life, his freedom, and the town he loves as he investigates his ex-wife's murder.
- **Leverage in Death #47 by J.D. Robb** - Lieutenant Eve Dallas puzzles over a bizarre suicide bombing in a Wall St. office building in the latest in the #1 New York Times bestselling series
- **The Suspect (Kate Waters #3) by Fiona Barton** - The new must-read standalone crime thriller from the author of *The Widow*, and *The Child* - featuring unforgettable journalist, Kate Waters. Kate a determined and successful reporter, travels to Thailand to investigate the disappearance of two eighteen-year-old girls from her home town while they were on a backpacking trip.

### FEATURED DVD MOVIES

- **The Sisters Brothers** - based on the novel by Patrick DeWitt, this is a reimagining of the cinematic Western as a dangerous, witty, and emotionally cathartic exploration of what it means to be a man. It is 1851, and Charlie and Eli Sisters are both brothers and assassins, boys grown to men in a savage and hostile world.
- **Little Italy** – A comedy topped with passion, playfulness, and pepperoni. Former childhood pals Leo and Nikki (Emma Roberts), are attracted to each other as adults-but will their feuding parents' rival pizzerias put a chill on their sizzling romance?
- **Sharp Objects** - After the murder of a preteen girl and the disappearance of another, reporter Camille Preaker (Amy Adams) reluctantly returns to her hometown to cover the crimes. Now, Camille has to work through her own personal trauma and risk falling into past self-destructive habits, while also clashing with her oppressive mother and trying to uncover the mystery behind what is happening in the city of Wind Gap.
- **Bohemian Rhapsody** – A celebration of Queen, their music and their extraordinary lead singer Freddie Mercury, who defied stereotypes and shattered convention to become one of the most beloved entertainers on the planet. The film traces the meteoric rise of the band through their iconic songs and revolutionary sound, their near-implosion as Mercury's lifestyle spirals out of control and their triumphant reunion on the eve of Live Aid, where Mercury, facing a life-threatening illness, leads the band in one of the greatest performances in the history of rock music.
