Festival Ontario to be held in Owen Sound

The Scenic City has been chosen by Theatre Ontario to host Festival Ontario '98, May 13 through 17. The festival will bring the best of community theatre in Ontario to the beautiful Roxy Theatre in downtown Owen Sound for competition.

Festival '98 is a joint project of Theatre Ontario, Western Ontario Drama League and Owen Sound Little Theatre. Participating plays will be the winners of the four major Community Theatre Festivals in Ontario; Western Ontario Drama League Festival, Eastern Ontario Drama League Festival, Association of Community Theatre of Central Ontario Festival and Quebec-Ontario Theatre Association Festival. 
