ANAVETS 56th DOMINION CONVENTION SEPT 8, 2024, SHERBROOK QUEBEC

Approximately 200 DELEGATES – Dominion President. 7 Vice Presidents and 7 Command Presidents. There were many guest speakers bringing us to date on factors that impact veterans.

VETERANS AFFAIRS – Afghanistan is now defined as War not Peace Keeping. Nov. 5 - 11 is Veterans Week - There are over 250,000 veteran's graves in Canada

Canadian Brig General – China is biggest challenge. Russia vs Ukraine. Our defence policy needs new equipment in face of budget cuts - "Remember what we do?

Ombudsman – A Lady – Who can make a complaint? CAF member and veterans – serving RCMP members – civilian with war time service – survivors and family members - How can we help" we will listen to you – we review your file – we walk you through the process. If we start a formal review of your complaint – we will explain how that works. We cannot make a change, we advocate for fairness, services are impartial, confidential and free.

U.S LEGION We stand with Canada, and we work together – we attend your conference, and you attend our conference. A number of medals for American Legion Friendship Medals were presented.

ROYAL CANADIAN LEGION – stated 43,000 new members – 1 new unit and 1 re-activated. 10th anniversary of Afghanistan. There were many people concerned with the increased numbers.

MEMORIAL FOUNDATION "NO STONE LEFT ALONE" This group was formed by a prominent veteran with the assistance of her 2 daughters. 200 communities have been developed in Canada 78,000 youth have been welcomed to visit grave sites in the winter and wearing a poppy, they are still growing.

CANADIAN WAR MUSEUM Glen Opton.

Collection Canadian Veterans and Research Wars

ATLAS INSTITUTE OF VETERANS Tools & strategies for daily living with Traumatic Brain Injury for veterans and families. Research – mobilizing - knowledge – coaching and training.

KING CHARLES III CORONATION MEDALS – 30,000 ARE BEING PRESNENTED BY MANY ORGAINZATIONS

RESOLUTIONS - there were 33 presented Advocacy 22 approved with 3 having short amendments.

Constitution -6 presented -2 were withdrawn and 4 were defeated.

Financial - 3 presented - one will impact all Units. A \$5.00 increase on Per capita tax.

It is important to note that we were over 25,000 members and are now 10,000 members and growing. I did state to all the Units that if we could increase our membership and we could get rid of the \$5 increase.

Our next convention will be in B.C. and Manitoba and NW Ont. will host in 2028.


The Battle of Britain was celebrated by 17 Wing at the Site on Air Force Way, on 15th September.

Established in Montreal in 1840 by a charter from the then new young Queen Victoria, it was a Canadian counterpart to the long-established Army and Navy Veterans in Great Britain which, along with Militia Institutes and United Services Institutes, was vigorously supported by the celebrated Duke of Wellington.

The ANAVETS in Canada, as we know it, is a not-for-profit organization with 15,000 members in 67 units across Canada. It was created by an Act of Parliament in 1917, which was amended in 1946 to include RCAF Veterans. We have one unit in the USA called ANAVICUS (Army, Navy and Air Force Veterans in Canada United States); and one unit in Mexico called ANAVETS Mexico Unit #19 (located in Lake Chapala, Jalisco, Mexico).
