Get to Know: Our new Seminarian Zachariah Black

Zachariah is currently in his 4th year of formation in the seminary, and in his 2nd year of the new Bachelor of Arts program in Catholic Medieval Philosophy.

What are your current course?

My current courses are Latin, Christianity and Literature, Ethics, Patristic Theology, and Ancient and Medieval Philosophy.

Do you have a favourite memory so far from your time in the Seminary?

I wouldn't say I have a favourite memory in the Seminary, I think I have too many to count. But something that's always fun are the end of semester skits we do in our different groups in the seminary. They're usually pretty funny!

Do you know where your pastoral placement will be?

I currently don't know where my pastoral placement and didn't have one last year. But in my first year of Formation, I worked with the St. Vincent de Paul Society, and in my second year I worked at the Marian Centre up until COVID hit.

When did you start believing the Priesthood might be for you?

Back at the end of grade 9 I felt that God was pulling the strings of my heart in the direction of the priesthood. I was reluctant at first but not long after I accepted that this might be God's will and have been travelling down this road ever since.

Now I'm still not even halfway through formation, and so anything is possible. Discernment is a huge part of the Seminary and just because I'm in the Seminary doesn't automatically mean I have a vocation to the priesthood.

Ultimately, it's whatever God's will for me is and I've been trying this year to focus on following God's will rather than assuming what it may be.
