You can now book a COVID-19 vaccine if you are over the age of 40 in Ontario. Below is the Provincial booking tool for pharmacies to receive the AstraZeneca Vaccine.

Eligibility:

- 60 years or older in this calendar year (born in or before 1961)
- 50 years or older and live in the area where postal codes begin with L9C or L8W (proof of address required at clinic)

Do I Need a Medical Consultation Before Being Vaccinated?

Some people may need to consult their healthcare provider before booking a vaccine appointment. If you fall into any of the categories below, you will be required to have a medical consultation before receiving the vaccine.

- You have a suspected hypersensitivity or have had an immediate allergic reaction to a previous dose of COVID-19 vaccine or polyethylene glycol (PEG) or polysorbate
- You have had a severe (e.g. anaphylaxis) or immediate allergic reaction to any other vaccine or injectable therapy (e.g. intramuscular, intravenous, or subcutaneous vaccines or therapies not related to a component of mRNA COVID-19 vaccines or polysorbates)
- You have had a severe allergic reaction (e.g. anaphylaxis) not related to vaccines or injectable medications – such as allergies to food, pet, venom, latex, environment, etc.
- You are or could be pregnant or breastfeeding
- You have problems with your immune system or you are taking medications that can affect your immune system (e.g. high-dose steroids, chemotherapy)
- You have an autoimmune disease
- You have a bleeding disorder or you are taking medications that could affect blood clotting (e.g. blood thinners)

If you need a medical consultation, book an appointment with your healthcare provider before booking your vaccine appointment.
