## **THE HISTORIAN'S CORNER**

Ross Castle - County Kerry

Standing defiantly on the shores of Lough Leane, the defenders of Ross Castle hoped the mystical presence and enchanting location of this 15th Century castle would hold up. Edmund Ludlow with 4,000 foot soldiers and 200 horses was the spearhead of Cromwell's forces. Ross Castle was one of the last Irish holdouts. The Irish had a prophecy that Ross Castle could never be taken by land and would never fall until a warship could "swim" on the lake and unbelievable prospect. During the Irish Confederate Wars, this prophesy seemed to be holding true. Ludlow did indeed build ships, built in Kinsale Cork, brought by water to Killorglin and then dragged by oxen to Lough Leane. Attacking by water and using artillery, General Ludlow finally forced the surrender of Ross Castle which was under the command of the Irish Lord Muskerry.

The world famous castle sits about a mile outside of the town of Killarney in the beautiful Killarney National Park in County Kerry Ireland. With rolling lush green hills, and surrounding mountains, Ross Castle has a commanding place on the shores of the majestic and mystical Lough Leane. With

the fog, rain, and sun of the Irish countryside, Ross Castle invokes the memory of ancient Irish Kings. Ross Castle is a 15th Century Medieval Irish Tower House. It is a remarkable example of native Irish Medieval architecture. This structure is not only a defensive fortress, but, it was also the home to local peoples who resided in this area of Kerry.

The Ancient Irish Chieftains, the powerful O'Donoghues Clan build the Tower house in the 1500's. At the time, the O'Donoghues were one of the most powerful clans in all of Ireland. Built with thick walls and consisting of a tower house, bawn, and with thick curtain walls, Ross Castle also included defensive flanking towers. On the lower levels, windows were small slits providing excellent views of attackers and protection for the inhabitants. Staircases were spiral and clockwise which gave the defenders the advantage of being able to swing a sword while the attackers would have difficulty maneuvering the weapon. Furthermore, the narrow staircase would force attackers to climb single file. This would enable a smaller garrison to defend the castle against a larger attacking force. Included in the design are two machicolations. These features allow the defenders to pour boiling water, oil, sand, or any other hot items on attackers. Sand being the favorite as it would penetrate chain armor. Ross Castle is an amazing example of Native Irish Medieval architectural techniques.

We must remember that these fortified "houses" were also the place of residence for Irish Chieftain clans. The most important room was the Great Hall. Fireplace, kitchen, gallery of

tapestries, these great halls invoke the vision of a romantic and forgotten time. The true glory of a castle can be seen in the majestic great room. The upper levels of the tower, with larger windows, would contain the living quarters and bedrooms.

The O'Donoghues would eventually lose control of the Castle to the MacCarthy clan during the Second Desmond rebellion. The MacCarthys would also lose the castle. At the close of the Confederate War, the Browne family would retain possession of Ross Castle. They too would lose the castle due to their allegiance to King James II of England. The Castle would remain an army barracks into the early 19th Century.

Ross Castle is shrouded in myth and legend. The lake and mystical lands that surround it support the historic medieval romance of its legacy. It is said that even today the O'Donoghues never left but live at the bottom of Lough Leane, in all their glory, still watching over the castle they built. The epic history of Ross Castle makes it a "must see" for any visitor to Killarney. The majestic Killarney National Park and the lake and hills that protect the castle help to maintain this valuable treasure. The cold dark colors of the castle blending in with the landscape as a protecting force blend softly with the lush landscape of Kerry brings visitors back to the days of Medieval Ireland and the Irish clans who lived there long ago.

## **FRESH APPLE PIE**

Betty Crocker Kitchens



- Prep 35 MIN
- Total 1 HR 10 MIN
- Servings 8

### **Ingredients**

1 package Betty Crocker™ pie crust mix  
 1/3 cup cold water  
 1/2 cup sugar  
 1/2 cup Gold Medal™ all-purpose flour  
 1/2 teaspoon ground cinnamon  
 1/4 teaspoon ground nutmeg  
 5 cups thinly sliced peeled apples (3 large)  
 1 tablespoon butter or margarine

### **Steps**

- **1** - Heat oven to 425°F. Make pie crust mix as directed for 9-Inch Two-Crust Pie, using 1/3 cup cold water--except trim overhanging edge of bottom pastry 1 inch from rim of plate.
- **2** - Stir together 1/2 cup sugar, the flour, cinnamon and nutmeg in large bowl. Add apples; toss. Spoon into pastry-lined pie plate. Dot with butter.
- **3** - Roll remaining pastry; cut into 10 strips, each about 1/2 inch wide. Place 5 strips across filling in pie plate. Weave a cross-strip through by first folding back every other strip of the first 5 strips. Continue weaving, folding back alternate strips before

adding each cross-strip, until lattice is complete. Trim ends. Fold trimmed edge of bottom crust over ends of strips, building up a high edge. Seal and flute. Brush lightly with milk; sprinkle lightly with additional sugar.

- **4** - Bake 30 to 35 minutes or until crust is golden brown and juice is bubbly.

## **Pumpkin Pie**

Betty Crocker Kitchens



- Prep 20 MIN
- Total 3 HR 20 MIN
- Servings 8

A traditional favorite made fuss-free with an easy pat-in-the-pan crust!

### **Ingredients**

#### **Pat-in-the-Pan Pastry**

1 1/3 - cups Gold Medal™ all-purpose flour  
 1/2 - teaspoon salt  
 1/3 - cup vegetable oil  
 2 - tablespoons cold water

#### **Filling**

2 - eggs  
 1/2 - cup sugar  
 1 - teaspoon ground cinnamon  
 1/2 - teaspoon salt  
 1/2 - teaspoon ground ginger  
 1/8 - teaspoon ground cloves  
 1 - can (15 oz) pumpkin (not pumpkin pie mix) SAVE \$

1 - can (12 oz) evaporated milk  
**Sweetened Whipped Cream**

3/4 - cup whipping cream  
 2 - tablespoons sugar

### **Steps**

- **1** - Heat oven to 425°F. In medium bowl, mix flour, 1/2 teaspoon salt and the oil with fork until all flour is

moistened. Sprinkle with cold water, 1 tablespoon at a time, tossing with fork until all water is absorbed. Shape pastry into a ball. Press in bottom and up side of 9-inch glass pie plate.

- **2** - In large bowl, beat eggs slightly with wire whisk or hand beater. Beat in 1/2 cup sugar, the cinnamon, 1/2 teaspoon salt, ginger, cloves, pumpkin and milk.
- **3** - To prevent spilling, place pastry-lined pie plate on oven rack before adding filling. Carefully pour pumpkin filling into pie plate. Bake 15 minutes.
- **4** - Reduce oven temperature to 350°F. Bake about 45 minutes longer or until knife inserted in center comes out clean. Place pie on cooling rack. Cool completely, about 2 hours.
- **5** - In chilled medium bowl, beat whipping cream and 2 tablespoons sugar with electric mixer on high speed until stiff peaks form. Serve pie with whipped cream. Store in refrigerator.
